Thank you for another wonderful week! We are settling into school routines, and with the fall season upon us, it's a great time to remind everyone that our first period begins at **8:25 a.m.**. Students should arrive a few minutes earlier so they have time to get organized and ready for the day.

This week, we will be practicing our **Hold and Secure drill**. A Hold and Secure may be initiated for a few reasons:

- If there is a medical situation inside the building that requires hallways and stairwells to remain clear, students will stay in their classrooms.
- If there is a situation in the community, students remain inside the school but continue moving throughout the building as usual.

During a Hold and Secure, no one is permitted to enter or leave the school building. So far this year, our students have successfully practiced both a fire drill and a lockdown drill. They did an excellent job with each, and we are proud of how seriously they are taking these safety drills.

<u>Medical Plans</u>: If your child has a medical condition that requires the use of medication (asthma puffers, insulin, epi pen, etc), we require a medical plan to be completed. <u>Families who have received health plan or anaphylaxis forms- we ask that they are completed and returned back to the school by Sept. 26th.</u>

New Literacy Screener for students in Grades 1 and 2 (English and French program)

In September, classroom teachers spend time getting to know their students and who they are as learners. Schools will be using *Universal Screening in Reading* for Grade 1 and 2 students in the English program and Acadience Reading Français for Students in French Immersion. This is one of the many ways teachers will assess learning.

What is Universal Screening in Reading?

It's a short (5-10 minute) activity that helps us see how your child is developing key reading skills. Think of it as a quick check-in on their reading journey, like looking at a map to see where they are and what might help them move forward.

Why do we do it?

The screening helps teachers understand children's strengths and where they may need extra support. This allows us to plan instruction, so students get what they need to succeed in reading.

Important to know:

This is *not* a test. There's no "pass" or "fail." It's a way for teachers to ensure students are supported in their learning.
