We also experienced some challenges last year, with many attendees leaving before the end of the performance, despite reminders. This impacted the experience for our students, and we want to ensure their hard work is fully appreciated.

In response, we're excited to partner with West Bedford High School during Special Events Week (December 8th–12th, 2025) to present a new and interactive way for students from Primary through Grade 6 to showcase their talents. During this week, we will host two evenings of events, where families can attend and enjoy performances by our Grade 6 Band, School Choir and Ukulele club. Students will also have the opportunity to display their artwork and projects throughout the school building. In addition, our Scholastic Book Fair will run during the week, both for students during the day and for families during one of the evening events. We hope this new format will provide a more relaxed and accessible way for families to enjoy and celebrate our students' creativity.

Throughout December, we will have various activities—both school-wide and classroom-based—that focus on celebrating the season. On December 1st, we will be setting up our school's Kindness Tree

and Sparkles, the Reindeer will begin making daily appearances throughout the building.
