Updates:

Morning drop off and afternoon pick up: We would like to extend our thanks to those families who continue to follow the school procedures for the morning drop off and afternoon pick up. This week, we will be sending home parking passes to our Pre-Primary Families to place in their front dash windows of their vehicles. This should speed up the process of traffic

flow for families going to the pre-primary drop off area. We continue to ask all of our families to please respect our procedures, as they will help to ensure students and staff are safe.

Hold and Secure Drill:

Another procedure the school will be practicing this week is a "Hold and Secure." During a hold and secure, classroom doors are secured and the students remain inside the room until instructed by the admin team that movement throughout the building can begin again. All exterior doors are locked and no one is permitted to enter or leave the building. Students are held within the school when circumstances make it safer to stay in the classroom rather than evacuate. Just as we prepare our students to properly respond to a fire drill, they also need to be aware of the proper response during a hold and secure drill. These drills should be treated with the same level of importance as fire drills. Please be assured that staff at our school will spend time discussing the importance of this procedure with students prior to conducting a drill. We will also take time after the drill to remind them that it was only a practice and there was no danger. Please take the time to speak with your son/daughter about this procedure and reinforce its importance. We practice these drills to ensure our school remains a safe place for teaching and learning.

Friday, September 29th, 2023- What is Orange Shirt Day?

The orange shirt is a symbol of the stripping away of culture, freedom and self-esteem experienced by Indigenous children over generations. On September 30th we wear orange shirts to honor the First Nation, Métis and Inuit children who were taken from their families and communities to be sent away to residential schools in Canada. The days surrounding Orange Shirt Day are an important time to learn more about the history of those schools.
