Family-Teacher Meetings: Our Family-Teacher meetings will occur on November 23, 2023 from 1:00-3:00 pm and 5:00-7:00 pm. There will be a sign-up link sent out to families on November 16th, 2023. Family meetings can occur in a variety of ways: In person, virtual meeting, or by phone.

Term 1 Report Cards: The Term 1 report cards will be sent out via EDUPOST (through the student PowerSchool information on file). These report cards will be sent out by end of day on November 28th, 2023.

Cell phones:

A key expectation for all students at WBS is that cell phones are to be put away and not used during 8:05 to 2:35 pm (this is the time that students are able to be on school grounds with teacher supervision). If families need to get a hold of their child, please call 902-405-0337. Cell phones are to be kept in book bags, and book bags are to be kept in their locker, their designated space in their classroom or their cubby. We have noticed that without their phones, students are engaging more in conversation with one another, and being more physically active. This is something that we would like to continue to foster.

We recognize that not all students and families agree with our no cell phone rule during certain times in the day. We feel strongly that by not having cellphones out, there are fewer opportunities for students to take photos or videos of others and then use/misuse them on social media platforms. The no cell phone expectation is one way we support our students in protecting their privacy and confidentiality and it reduces the opportunity for cyber-bullying. We ask that our families work with us by supporting this expectation at West Bedford School.

WBS Cafeteria: Our cafeteria is now open to all students at West Bedford School PP-8. We strongly encourage online ordering to help reduce the wait times for food. Please ensure that you are selecting your child's teacher, as lunches will be delivered to the classroom for students in PP to Grade 3. If your child changed classes in September/early October, please ensure that you have the new teacher selected.

One of the expectations in the cafeteria is that students remain seated while they are eating and socializing. Students can get up to throw things out and to use the washroom, but for safety reasons we are asking students to find a spot and stay there for the 20-25 minutes they have to eat and relax.

Another expectation for students is that they clean up after themselves. There has been a lot of food and garbage left on tables and thrown to the floor or around the cafeteria. This has been disappointing for us as a school community, as we know that food insecurity is prevalent within our greater community. Please remind your child to clean up after themselves when they are done eating.

Morning Arrival- We understand that there may be days when it takes longer to get to school. Arriving prior to the 8:25 am start time, however, sets students up for success. It allows students time to get settled for their day, to socialize with classmates and to touch base with a teacher, if needed. Students should arrive between 8:05 to 8:24 am and enter through their assigned coloured door. Please know if students ride a bus and the bus arrives after 8:25 am they will not be marked late.

School Advisory Council- The first SAC Meeting was held on Tuesday, October 17th from 6:30-7:30 pm at WBS.

We are currently looking for 3 non-parent community members to join our committee. We have sent out an expression of interest form November 3rd and it is due back by November 10th.

Online Demographic Forms- The portal to submit the demographic form to update important information continues to be open. This form was emailed to families. The form includes phone numbers, email addresses, emergency contacts, and medical information. This online demographic form replaces the paper copy of the registration form. Please submit this form with any updates ASAP. The school uses the information we have on file for many reasons. If your information is not up to date then you may not receive our memos, report cards, or other information. The media consent is also in the demographic form. Without an updated consent students will not be able to have their photo in the yearbook or any other social media platforms.

Nut Free Building- <u>This is VERY IMPORTANT!</u> We have a number of students who have life threatening allergies to all types of nuts (Tree nuts and ground nuts). We ask that all food that is sent to school is nut free.

Scent Free Building- We ask that scented products (deodorant, perfume, lotion, etc) not be worn while in the building. We have several students and staff who will have a severe allergic reaction to scents.
